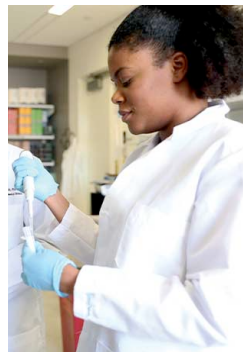

Professional Development: Elevator Pitch Do's and Don'ts



Check out some examples:



An elevator pitch is a concise introduction to who you are and what you do. Through this short introduction (think: the length of an elevator ride), your audience should learn what your skills and expertise are, and have a reason to follow up



1. Keep it brief (30 - 60 seconds)
2. Start with an enticing introduction that catches your audience's attention
3. Highlight your skills and what you can offer
4. Share your goals
5. End with something you or your audience can act upon, such as a request to "connect" on LinkedIn or an invitation for coffee!



1. Exaggerate
2. Speak too fast or ramble
3. Lose your audience with too many details
4. Deliver the same pitch every time, personalize it based on your audience!!!!
5. Talk in a monotone voice
